

Phoenix Supporting Artists:

Getting to BBC Roath Lock

The postcode for Roath Lock is CF10 4GA, but please be mindful that this is a new postcode and may not be recognised by online services or GPS devices.

For Sat Nav use, you may wish to input TYNESIDE ROAD CF10 4NR – carry on through Tyneside Road, over the small bridge, turn right by the dock entrance roundabout and then you will arrive at BBC Roath Lock.

Parking outside the studios:

Supporting Artists: Do not attempt to access the BBC Roath Lock car parks. These are limited spaces for Crew, Principal Actors and BBC Staff ONLY.

Parking by Meters is available right outside the studios on the road. It costs £5 for 12 hours and the Card Readers rarely work, so you need to take CASH to avoid delays in parking.

Parking in Cardiff Bay

The APCOA Waterside Car Park (Pierhead Street, CF10 4PH Tel: 02920 472 691) is a 10 minute walk from Roath Lock.

The Waterside multi storey car park is adjacent to the Wales Millennium Centre and is the largest car park close to Roath Lock. There is a number 6 bus stop close by with a public bus service to and from Roath Lock every 10 minutes.

Next door to the Waterside Car Park is the RED DRAGON car park, it is free to park but only if you purchase food inside the Red Dragon centre.

Car sharing

By Bus

To get between Cardiff city centre and Cardiff Bay, the BayCar or 'Bendy Bus' (no.6) is available. This service runs 7 days a week, every 10 minutes during the day and every 15 minutes during the evening and weekends. The route runs anti-clockwise around Cardiff city centre and down to the Bay where it stops outside the Doctor Who Experience and Wales Millennium Centre. The stop for Roath Lock is immediately outside Roath Lock reception. For more details visit www.cardiffbus.com.

By Train

Cardiff Bay train station is a 15 minute walk from Roath Lock. A regular train service operates between Cardiff Bay and Cardiff Queen Street stations, where connections are available to Cardiff Central station, the South Wales valleys and the Vale of Glamorgan. Arriva Trains Wales permits the carriage of bicycles on services between Cardiff Bay and Cardiff Queen Street stations.

By Bicycle

There are excellent cycle routes into Cardiff Bay from many parts of the city, including off-road cycle routes from the City Centre and the Cardiff International Sports Village into Mermaid Quay.

There are 58 cycle racks located in Roath Lock's East Car Park, accessible via the cycle gate. These cycle racks are available on a first come, first served basis and are for commuter use only. There are further bicycle parking facilities throughout Porth Teigr and Cardiff Bay. Sports lockers and showers are available in Roath Lock.
